HOW IT ALL BEGAN!

As Program Director for SCOV back in 2007 and 2008, Pam Sarpalius kept hearing about a strange sport called Pickleball from those seeking a retirement destination and from her searches on what's new to bring to our community. After some checking, she realized that pickleball is a growing sport that needed to be a part of Sun City.

When Bob Mariani became GM at SCOV, Pam approached Bob about bringing this new sport here. With a thumbs up from the General Manager and approval from the SCOV board, the next steps were to put in some courts! At the time the tennis courts were being refurbished. Since the equipment was already here, it was decided to go ahead and put in pickleball courts after the tennis court work was completed.

But where? At the time, Shuffleboard courts were where our current courts 1 and 2 are located and bocce courts where courts 3-5 are currently located. It was decided to take out shuffleboard altogether and put two pickleball courts in their place. The courts were built between May and September 2009 at a cost of \$84,109. The courts were completed but there was still not a pickleball club here at SCOV.

Saddlebrooke, who already had a pickleball club, was invited to come and demonstrate the sport to those who were interested in learning how to play and to help get a new club off the ground.

THE FIRST YEAR...2009!

Although the SCOV Pickleball Club didn't officially come into existence until December 16, 2009 when the charter was approved by SCOV, the club was beginning to take shape. Two people helped make that happen...Marge Allen and Sandra Kennedy. The first board meeting of the newly formed pickleball club was held in October of 2009.

The Saddlebrooke Pickleball Club helped tremendously by providing the new board information on where to purchase equipment, the rules of the game, scoring and holding tournaments. Ginny Phillipi, one of our charter members, also volunteered to give lessons to new members. Dues that first year was only \$5.00 and the money was used primarily to purchase paddles and balls.

Early Accomplishments: In January 2010, three members of our club participated in the Senior Pickleball Olympics and won 2 golds and 1 silver! In April, 2010, our club held its first tournament for members. There were 36 who participated.

Tips to Improve Your Play!

BEGINNNERS 101 TIPS - PART TWO Shot Selection

Don't try to make the highlight reel: too many beginners love trying to hit a "winner". While it is fun to hit that "fist-pumping" winning shot, trying to smash the ball past your opponents or hit a tricky shot - more often times than not ends in an unforced error rather than the intended winner.

Rather than trying hit the ball as hard as you can, dial it back a little bit. Think if driving in 3rd gear- slow and steady rather than trying to blast by everyone in the fast lane. Hit at a level that feels about 3/4 of your strength rather than trying to hit as hard as possible. Learn to be patient, get the ball over the net and let your opponent make the mistakes. Ultimately, you'll win more points by letting the opponent committing errors than you will by hitting winners.

Most beginners didn't even attempt the Third Shot Drop. To be fair, the drop shot is a difficult shot, even many very advanced pickleball players will admit it's one of the toughest shots for them to perfect, so it's understandable that a new player struggles with it. Why do beginners totally ignore the drop shot completely? Most common answer: FEAR! Fear of messing up. Fear of losing the point and disappointing their partner. Fear of not clearing the net, committing an unforced error.

Don't be afraid! Start trying the "Third Shot Drop"! Yes, you'll probably lose some points at first and no it won't always land where you want it. But it's a powerful shot and can be a very useful weapon. So the advice is to just start using it more-simple as that. Having said that, that does NOT mean you should be using the drop shot on every third shot.

In general, you want to keep your opponents back as much as possible using long hard drives to keep them deep- but for times when the other team is already up at the net you can buy yourself extra time to approach the NVZ by using the drop because the drop shot takes an extra second or so longer than a hard drive - it gives you precious time needed to rush up to the kitchen line.
